Certainly heading into a marriage takes a bold attitude. Optimism





The Betsy has expanded since my visit and these are the exciting details.

To the west, two historic buildings whose architects were in large part responsible to the Art Deco architecture movement in South Beach, are being linked to The Betsy by a bridge, creating public art.

When renovation is fully complete, the footprint of The Betsy will comprise its current Ocean Drive entrance building—the Colonial Wing with 59 rooms and suites and a fully-restored Art Deco Wing with 70 rooms and suites (30 of which will have balconies), plus a new casual Italian restaurant.

The current Betsy property will add a rooftop pool with outstanding views of the Art Deco district and the ocean and the impressive Miami skyline. A second ocean view deck will be added and The Conservatory, which will remain a vibrant setting for the arts, will add an expresso bar, a performance stage and a new meeting space.

The fee is \$150 but half is used for the sanitation of the rooms and elimination of any potential pet allergies for the room's future use and the other half to support dog shelter activities throughout the world.

Pampering with your pooch is a new take on a couples massage. With your pup at your side you can enjoy magic fingers, aromatherapy and even healthy nibbles afterwards. If that is over the top for you, perhaps you would like to take a walk up and down Ocean Drive to experience a fairy-tale experience. How fun! The folks on the drive are one of a kind in their own right and the art-deco back drop is amazing.

I loved sitting with a cocktail and our dog Gia on the enchanting front porch that extends to Chef Laurent Tourondel's LT Steak & Seafood, where the culinary creations are only enhanced by South Beaches' only boutique hotel, The Betsy. There is never a reason to leave the property to eat and if seated outside, your pet is welcome to join you at LT's.

What's the history of the hotel? Built in 1942, it was immediately acclaimed for its Florida/Georgian architecture. With extensive renovations ending in 2007, it re-opened as the present day Betsy.
